Bicker Process Reimagined

Dear TI Family,

As the Vice President and Bicker Chair, one of my main goals was to host more pre-bicker events in order to ensure that everyone who was interested in TI had the opportunity to see how glorious our Club truly is. This manifested into a WomINN's trivia event, a winter festival open house (where sophomores had the opportunity to meet members while participating in winter-themed events like gingerbread house making) and a carnival the week before bicker. All of these events helped introduce bickerees—who may not have had many affiliations in the Club—to feel comfortable within the space going into Street Week. We also hosted 2 rounds of coffee chats where prospective bickerees were able to sit down with members of their particular affinity groups to get a sense of the Club from that perspective (e.g. Women, LGBTI, First Gen-Low Income and People of Color).

TI Bicker itself is very different than it was a couple of years ago. We received feedback from sophs that our opening day costume party followed by a frenetic game day made bickerees feel uncomfortable and didn't allow them to get to know the junior and senior members of the Club. Bicker now consists of three days of conversations. Days 1 and 2 were a series of two-on-two conversations, and Day 3 was all one-on-ones. These interactions were carefully curated by the Bicker Committee in order to ensure that all conversations were properly random and fair. This ensured that no members were bickering Sophomores with whom they were acquainted and that all bickerees are talking to new members each day. Although tedious, crafting the conversations before bicker was one of the reasons we received such positive feedback on our process.

Bickerees expressed that our bicker was one of the most organized on the Street, which made bickering TI much less stressful and more enjoyable. Bickerees also loved the format of the conversations as they reported feeling much more connected to the membership and more excited about the Club after spending time getting to know both other bickerees as well as our current members. I am so happy with the way that bicker turned out this year and know that with our new officer corps, bicker will continue to be a wonderful process!

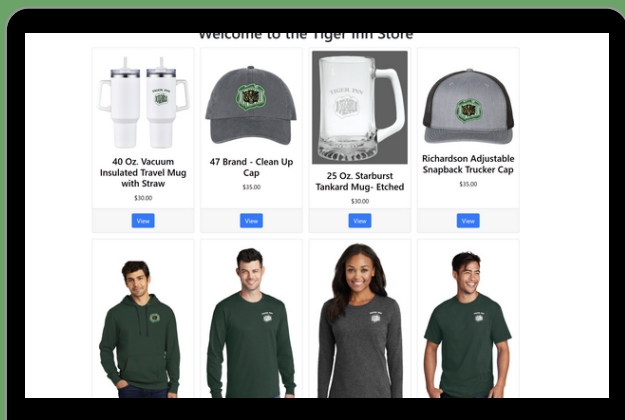
